Ride Rating System

Mileage: Is total distance for the ride's route. Ride may include options for variations on the route and if so will specify additional distances within the ride description.

Pace: Is the speed a rider is expected to maintain on flat terrain with no wind. Think of it as an indicator of level of effort. Actual speed would be slower on climbs and faster on descents. The Pace is also not equivalent to average speed, because a route usually includes stops (rest stops, stop signs or lights, etc.), which will reduce the average speed.

Terrain: A descriptor of the ride's route terrain. In order from easiest to more difficult: flat; minor hills; moderate hills; frequent, steep hills; and advanced, difficult climbing.

2024 El Tour de Tucson Trip Report



The 2024 El Tour De Tucson was one of the most attended and successful events for NMTS participants since pre-pandemic. We had 14 attendees which included 13 riders, some of whom were attempting (and completing) their longest rides ever!

Most of the group arrived on Thursday, November 21 and attended packet pickup either Thursday or Friday inside the Tucson Convention Center (a five-minute bike ride from our hotel.) There were dozens of booths offering cycling clothing, equipment & etc., as well as a bike valet and a beer outlet.

On Friday the 22nd we were all ready to ride one of the two "warm-up" rides planned for that day. Most folks opted for a 35-mile out & back to a delightful coffee shop/bakery on the totally flat portion of Tucson's incredible Huckleberry Bike Trail. Two folks opted for the longer 56-mile (and less flat) entire Huckleberry Loop, which also features a terrific coffee/pastry stop.

Saturday the 23rd was the official El Tour Rides. NMTS was represented by 13 riders, one of whom accomplished the Century (104-miles), two at 34-miles (Half-Metric Century) and eleven rode the Metric Century (63-miles). The "Girl Scout" rest stop, which is about 10 miles from the end of the rides, and is always among the best stops, was truly phenomenal this year. In addition to their usual fare of Girl Scout Cookies (some slathered with peanut butter!) they offered hard-boiled eggs, potato pieces, pickles, and pickle juice in addition to the typical fruit and granola snacks. Plenty to power the riders into the final ten miles!

The weather for both days was perfection- sunny, windless, and around 60° to start, and in the mid-80s to finish.

Tucson offers a plethora of dining and drinking choices, which the NMTS folks leveraged to their advantage: from steak house to Italian to brew-pub, you name it, we ate there! That's why we can ride over 100 miles and still manage to gain weight over the weekend. Everyone had a great time and we'll look forward to doing it again.
